



Contractor's and Business Licenses*

Contracting companies should have a State Certified Contractor qualify their business. For your protection, it is recommended that the qualifier be the owner of the company and have been operating under the same name for a minimum of 5 years.

Insurance Certificates*

Confirm in writing that your contractor carries a general liability insurance policy by requesting a certificate of insurance form prior to commencement of the job. Conscientious contractors carry no less than \$1,000,000 of General Liability coverage. If your contractor's insurance policy doesn't cover potential damages, then the contractor is liable. If he cannot cover the damages himself, you may have no legal recourse and may end up paying for any possible damages or injuries yourself. Many contractors are not financially stable... and don't carry proper insurance coverage/limits to protect you against losses. *See representative for current certificate.
